


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# Janson's Basic History Of Western Art (9th Edition) (History Of Art)

Look, if you're getting this book it is because you're taking a class somewhere. Likely, you're taking this class because you have to fulfill some oddball requirement that likely isn't relevant to anything you care about in your degree path. That doesn't mean the book isn't informative. If you actually take the time to read it, you will find that the "direction" of the book is pointing out the impact of geopolitical events on various art forms and styles and how events of the times dictated the direction of many artists. Often times the book will spend half a page talking about the intricacies of a specific piece of art but will NOT provide you anything to see what they are talking about. Its a shame really. This book is best used in conjunction with the internet so you can actually read up on some of their glossed over topics and see the works in detail that they attempt to describe but fail to show.
