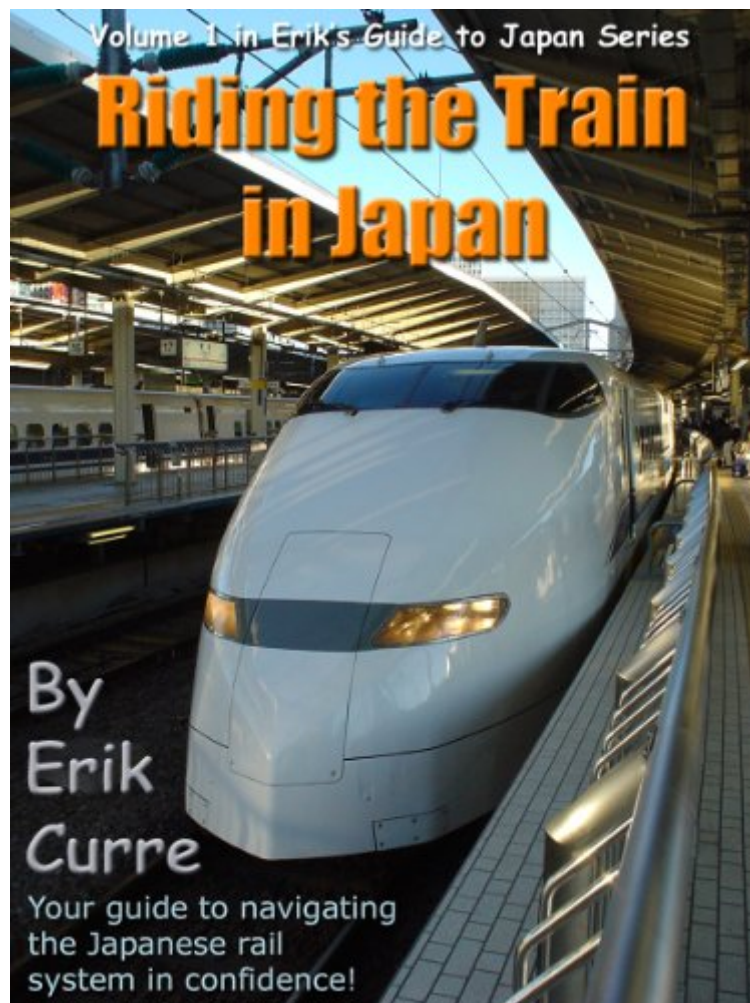

I have traveled to Japan twice and used various trains there. My wife and I plan to visit Japan

together; this book has given us self confidence to face the Ticket Machine which is clearly described in the book. The book also contains links to various websites, which are easily reached on my Kindle Fire. My wife thinks that this book is clearly worth the small price.

I have been going to Europe at least once each year for the past 15 years or so. This year I am changing direction and going to Japan. At this point I too am a "zen master of train station navigation" (as Erik describes himself). If I had had a little booklet like this covering the European train systems, I would have achieved that status in 10% of the time it ultimately took. Even if you only spend a couple of hours on train travel in Japan, this booklet provides considerably more than the two bucks it costs - in general information that you will use.

This book was a huge help on our recent, first-time trip to Japan. We would have been totally lost without it. It is true that there are helpers in the larger stations, but not enough, and their English was not always up to our confusion. The trains were unbelievably good. Clean. Quiet.
