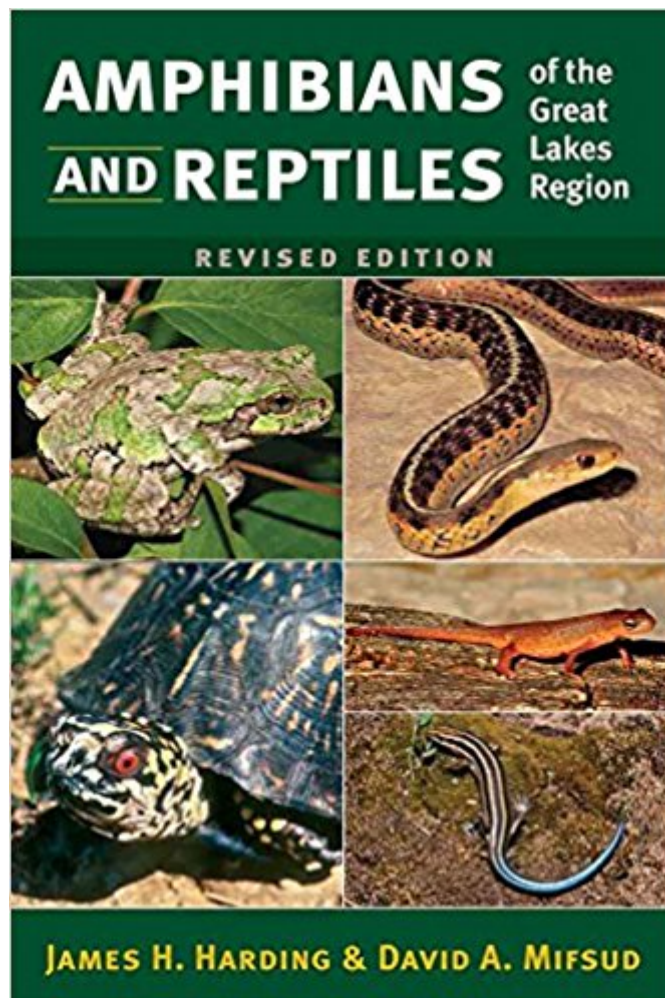




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Amphibians And Reptiles Of The Great Lakes Region, Revised Ed. (Great Lakes Environment)
