About This Edition: New Features

New: A video created specifically for Horizons, "Les Stagiaires," integrates the vocabulary and grammar from each chapter into a storyline of two new interns working at an office. Their daily interactions and adventures with their coworkers depict real-life uses of French in a variety of situations, allowing students to practice listening skills with the vocabulary and structures they have studied up to that point. Brief episodes appearing in the "Reprise" section of each chapter are accompanied by viewing activities.

New: The "Sélections Musicales" sections have been expanded to include the use of French music as an engaging way to teach culture, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation. Manley (2011) is a pretty good french book. If I had done the assigned readings before the day of an exam and not relied on my instructor's poor style and teaching philo I would have probably done better. The book explains language pretty well. But let's be honest: you're not buying this book because you want to learn french. You're buying it because it's on a booklist. Buy it used. Seriously. Don't let the bookstore's online component combo scare you away. You can buy the book used then buy a 3-term quia pack for like \$60. That's it. Bon chance!

The text is based on an immersion theory -- relatively little English is used to explain the lessons beyond the initial instructions. Reading the lesson directions thus becomes an exercise in itself. The dialogue exercises place the reader in everyday events, as if he or she were encountering the situation in France. The book also includes generous information about the French culture -- introductions to cities and regions are comprehensive and included before each chapter. This is a fast-paced, full-throated look at French and all its nuances.
