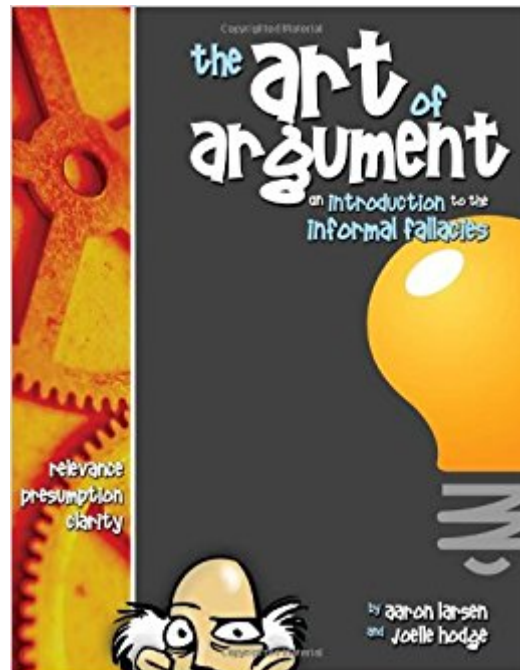

I have used Fallacy Detective and now this one. I love the stories and the examples that have you figure out what fallacy you are looking at in Fallacy Detective (with the answers in the back) but love the layout and visual examples of Art of Argument. For now, I have merged the two to help my child learn to identify the fallacies, which can be difficult when first learning them.

I'd title it as Identifying Fallacies. It emphasizes that arguments are for enlightening the other party or audience on a subject, not bashing them. It's a very interesting book. Love the fake advertisements in it.

We've just started reading and working in this book, but it's so easy to understand. Now we're picking apart a lot of commercials and having fun with it. This is a great homeschooling tool.

Understandable and interesting descriptions of each of the logical fallacies, with engaging questions and activities. Each fallacy's section is short and simple, making it an easy thing to fit in to your plan for the day or week. My almost 11-yr-old finds it really interesting, but I think I enjoy it even more!
