

Tracy Kidder has a knack for making his readers feel "up close and personal" with his subjects....bigger than life high achievers like Paul English, Paul Farmer, Tom White and even my old travel buddy Joel Cutler via cameo. Vivid portrayal of what real entrepreneurs are...and are not.

Not as compelling as Tracy Kidder's other books. Just "Okay." I actually know Paul English, and his genuine brilliance doesn't come through in the book.

A fascinating look at a successful entrepreneur/venture capitalist fighting his demons! A great read

and a look at the high tech world.

This book was particularly interesting to me because I grew up with Paul and went to high school with him at Boston Latin. In fact, I even started my career at Boston Latin in the same room with the old IBM computer writing Fortran programs on punch cards. I even got to experience some of Paul's obsession with fast cars when he gave me a ride home from a party in high school in his old Camaro, topping 70 mph in a 30 mile-per-hour zone. I think I can say that since that the statute of limitations is now past ;-I followed Paul's career from a distance and had the opportunity to work with him a little bit when he joined the board of the startup company where I was the head of marketing and product management. The thing that was most surprising about this book was how accurately Mr. Kidder captured Paul's life Â“ or at least the small parts that I experienced firsthand. Like some of the other reviewers, I would have appreciated to hear more about Paul's philanthropic endeavors or his struggle with bipolar disorder. At the same time, going to deep would have felt like an invasion of his privacy. But overall, the thing that was most interesting to me was the description of the elements that made him most successful in his multiple endeavors. I think Paul's formula is pretty simple Â“ he does things he is extremely passionate about and he assembles a team of great people to deliver on his vision. He also does have an uncanny ability for hiring great talent. While I may have a slightly different perspective than others, I would think that anyone who has an interest in entrepreneurial ventures would learn a great deal from this book. And although it doesn't illuminate every facet of Paul's life, I can attest to the fact that the ones I personally experienced were accurately depicted in a very compelling way.

A superb case study of new entrepreneurs. A range from tech smart to bipolar transitions. Beautifully crafted to capture the scope from schemes to startups, and human to the point of gentle irony from a base that makes greed as futile as hate.
