

is like a map to the somewhat confusing and evolving world of public art. Some of the information is no longer current and I look forward to the next edition.

I am not just saying this because the book was written by a personal friend: I recommend it as a public art professional for having spot-on advice and portraying the world of public art as it really is. It's a good basic reference for all artists looking to get into, or get better at, public art, as it teaches the norms of the field and is written in a style that sounds like a conversation with a knowledgeable friend.
