

For three decades, best-selling author and editor David Elliot Cohen has created books that have sold six million copies worldwide. Most were in the immensely popular Day in the Life and America 24/7 photography book series. He has four New York Times bestsellers and two international bestsellers to his credit. Cohen is a graduate of Yale University. He lives in Manhattan with his wife, Laureen Seeger, and the youngest of their five children.

I enjoyed it very much. Good read for everyone especially dog lovers.

The engaging pup on the cover caught my eye, but then when I read a few pages, I discovered it's really a meditation about life, love, home and the passage of time. Imagine Bill Bryson writing about a road trip across America with two old friends-one a fellow biped, the other an ailing Labrador during his last week of life. Their journey takes them to some of the quirkiest places in the country, (while they muse about their lives as only old friends can), but the detour to the author's home town is the part that has stayed with me. This is not another schmaltzy dog story-in this book dogs do what old dogs do. I read it in just a few days, and turned to the last page with regret.

David Elliot Cohen's œThe Wrong Dog• is a very personal memoir of love, loss, friendship and a quest that drives the narrative to a very satisfying conclusion. While

Ã¢ÂœpersonalÃ¢Â• should be an assumed requisite of any memoir, many are just not that intimate or revealing of the contradicting impulses, less flattering behavior, confusion and vulnerability at the core of being alive and human. That to me is what makes any good memoir useful and helps us to consider our own life choices. Cohen pulls the reader in quickly with his unsparing, frank storytelling and thus risks his dignity and pride, revealing his own flaws. At the same time, we see a generous heart beneath his practiced tough guy exterior. Thus we care about him and his moving story about a fraught cross-country mission he takes with a close friend to get his familyÃ¢Â™s dying dog from California to New York. They hope to arrive in time to reunite their beloved Simba one last time with DavidÃ¢Â™s wife and children. Their journey is part classic road trip where we get CohenÃ¢Â™s insightful and humorous mediations on American culture as they visit roadside attractions, but their trip turns painful when they reach his parents home. His mother is dying a horrible death and his father is struggling with his own illness. No, you canÃ¢Â™t compare the death of a family pet with the death of your mother, but in sharing this uncomfortable juxtaposition Cohen really makes us think about what defines a life well lived. Before the Battle of Big Horn, Crazy Horse is believed to have said Ã¢ÂœItÃ¢Â™s a good day to die.Ã¢Â• That graceful acceptance of the inevitable comes to mind after finishing Ã¢ÂœThe Wrong Dog.Ã¢Â• ItÃ¢Â™s not giving away too much to say that the ending, although not quite as dramatic as CusterÃ¢Â™s Last Stand, brings a poetic and fitting death. And it makes you think. How you die is not something you typically control, nor can you control the world. But you can control how you react to the world - living well might just afford you a good death, and that seems to me now a very good thing indeed.

Definitely one of those books where you reach the last page far too quickly. A sweeping read that takes you not just on a road trip (a race against time to reunite an old dog with his family) but also on an exploration of life, death, time and companionship. I definitely recommend this charming book. It's thought-provoking without being overly self-important. Not an easy feat!
