

While reading history or more fact oriented historical fiction I have often wished the story of Henry VIII would not have played out as it did. This story is based on the "what if..." premise that Anne Boleyn was Henry VIII second and last wife and gave him a viable son. Anne becomes queen and the son eventually becomes king, but it is far from happily ever after. The court is still a pit of wipers rife with conflict and scandal. I plan to read the other two books in the series. The first book seems to indicate that the alternative history will merge into more factual history with Elizabeth becoming queen. I can't wait to find out how it will all unfold.

I would actually give this one a 3 1/2. Not great writing, but that's not the point. Intriguing premise, engaging characters, well rendered dialogue.

The author began with a fascinating premise: what if Anne Boleyn had given Henry VIII the son he wanted? As far as I know, no one has done this before, and that alone makes it worth reading for

any lover of Tudor history and fiction. While the writing was a bit uneven, the story held my attention, and made me very curious about what will come next. I'm really enjoying this version of Elizabeth Tudor, even though she's not the main character.

I was really excited about this book when I read the description. Historical fiction is fiction after all, so why not change it up. Ann Boleyn and her family rocked the entire world. Before all the Tudor books and movies, she is best remembered for losing her head by most people. This actually takes it to a whole new level. Had she lived, how would she and her brother influenced the throne? Though it read a bit like a teen drama, I did enjoy seeing what Andersen's imagination could do with young William(Henry 1X), his sister Elizabeth and all the other people tangled up in the web of intrigue of the Tudor court.

It's entertaining to read a story about "what if?" What if Queen Anne had had a son? I can't wait for the next one!
