

As I looked for this book on I realized that most junior league cookbooks seem to have a cult-like following. I found a junior league cookbook from another state to order and just hope it's as good as this classic!

I've owned this cookbook for 10+ years, and I have to have given at least 10 copies over the years as gifts. Timeless recipes from great cooks that were tested repeatedly amongst JL members and their families. One of the guidelines for selecting recipes for testing was that the ingredients were relatively easy to find.
