Bought for a 6-7 year old. This is a fantastic book for expanding your child's creativity with Lego's.

The schematics in these books are not the same as you may find in the the lego boxes. The usual pages that call out for 3 of this and 4 of that are not there and steps sometimes take larger leaps. Don't worry though, the illustrations of the assemblies are very easy to read and this book is well worth the money. The reading isn't so much required which allows the younger readers to really get into flipping through the pages. The LEGO official books tend to be a bit more wordy with less step by step pictorals. I would highly recommend this book over any of those. It doubles as a great living room table book with tons of interesting pictures to look at. NOTE: If you've got a bin full of unsorted lego though you may want to do a little organizing before you give your child this book, otherwise going to be a lot of plastic on plastic noise.

I bought this for my LEGO-crazy kids (4,4&2). They eagerly poured over the pages and picked different projects to build. There are all skill levels of projects and ideas to choose from.

We got this for our 11 year old as part of his birthday gift and he loves it. He as well as our other 3 kids love Legos. This book has so many great building ideas with instructions on how to build them unlike some other books we looked at. We are very happy with this book and have order the other 3 books in the set as well.

I bought this for my 9 year old and it's a nice companion volume to the first one. Imaginative builds spur creativity, but the directions for the creations in the book involve large number of specialty bricks.

Great Lego book, I have seen so many books that do not go into detail on how to build projects. This book has several detailed builds with an inventory list of what pieces you need and it's in a comic book form. I would recommend this book to anyone who loves Lego and for those just starting out trying to get ideas.

I bought this as a birthday present for the kid that owns a thousand lego kits but is convinced that the pieces are only for the kit they came with. Not only did I win an argument with a 7 year old but now the creations are endless. The only con is that a lot of the "recipes" include rarer or odd pieces that aren't in typical kits. If you have kid that understands the concept of substitutions or creative license, this is the book, hands down.
