

K-Gr 3-Read by the author, Mary Pope Osborne, this collection includes four book: Night of the Ninjas, Afternoon on the , Sunset of the Sabertooth, and Midnight on the Moon (all Random House). The stories flow easily, each one picking up where the prior one left off. Osborne does a good job of summarizing both at the beginning of each book and within the story where necessary. The collection begins with Jack and Annie following clues to find Morgan, their missing magical librarian friend, as the tree house takes them to ancient Japan, the rainforest, the Ice Age, and finally into the future and onto the moon. Librarians will love this series for its emphasis on books and reading as the keys to solving mysteries and discovering adventures. The dialogue doesn't necessarily lend itself well to audiobook format due to the repetition of "said Jack" and "said Annie," which becomes glaringly obvious when spoken aloud. Osborne's narration is adequate, but her attempts at kid-like voices, particularly Annie's, err a little bit on the side of cute. Nevertheless, young fans of the series aren't likely to mind, and the wide listening level makes this a good choice for audiobook

I read this to my 3 and 4 year old boys and they LOVED it. It's a little a repetitive, but I think that is probably best for young soon-to-be readers. I am a huge scifi and fantasy fan and I thought the stories were pretty compelling. The ninja story is particularly well done, with no violence, but a ton of action. On that note they might be a teeny bit scary for a 3 year old. There is a lot of suspense.

My 6 yo loves these books. He's now 7 and we just keep reading them and enjoying them. Great age appropriate and educational adventures.
