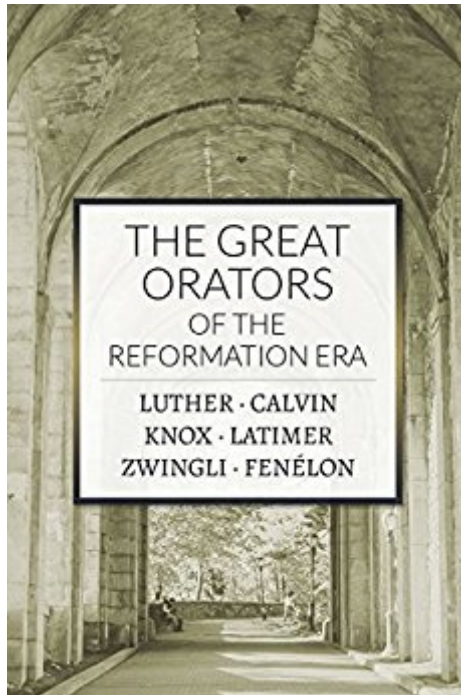

The orations or sermons gathered in this volume affords one of theological thinking as expounded from the chancel, in a sermon. I was somewhat disappointed with the first sermon printed. The sermon was preached by John Wycliffe, an early reformer of the church in England. The translation did not transpose it in modern English, neither in vocabulary or grammar. This requires more time to read and to formulate in one's own thinking what Wycliffe was driving at. Most of the work printed

is informative and understandable. The sermons printed/chosen present a broad spectrum of thinkers who lived during the Age of the Reformation..
