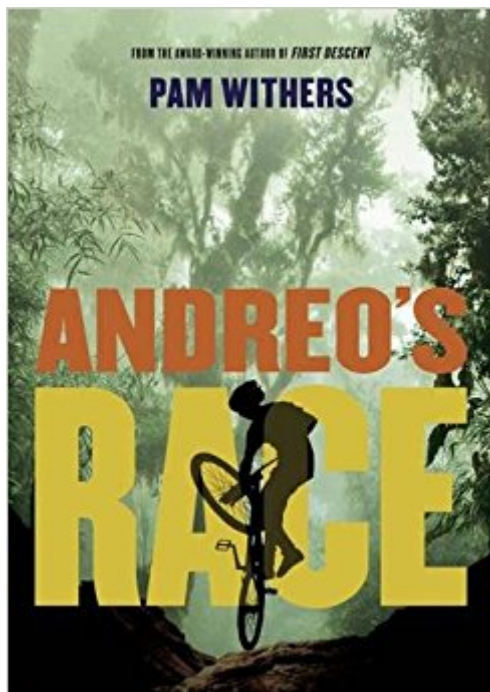

Gr 8 Up "This action-packed book revolves around the topics of adventure races and illegal adoptions, managing to make both interesting and highly readable. Sixteen-year-old Andreo was adopted as a baby, and his family's upcoming team adventure race in Bolivia is a chance for him to learn more about his origins. When his friend and fellow adoptee Raul discovers that they may have been stolen as babies from their rightful parents, the pair resolve to investigate during the race. Andreo navigates through nighttime cycling, awkward family dynamics, and wanted criminals in his search for his birth mother. The experience of adventure racing is brought to life in the story, with

readers experiencing the intensity of training and competition through Andreo. The excitement of the sport is mirrored by his emotional hunt for clues leading to his birth family, and his discoveries and achievements are well paced. Andreo's imperfect relationship with his adoptive family is the most strained part of the story but works as a plot device, and is resolved in the all's-well ending.

A fast-paced action-packed read that had me turning the pages as fast as I could. I enjoyed Withers book "Descent" but this one is even better. Full of adventure, serious topics such as adoption and baby trafficking are mixed with extreme sports in an adventure race across Bolivia including canoeing, mountain biking, and caving. A former whitewater rafter and outdoor enthusiast, along with being the mother of boys, it's quite apparent the author writes what she knows best and that comes through in her writing which is full of detail and obvious research. The book begins with the two 16yo main characters biking in the Rockies at night and the action, tension and drama never stops for a moment until the exciting climax. Mixed in there is also the story of a family who learns a lesson in how to be closer as a family by showing love and trust with each other plus we see the dark side of baby trafficking from all sides. A riveting read and one of those books that could grab the attention of a reluctant reader who is into extreme sports.

Andreo's Race was an intriguing story that kept the reader interested from beginning to end. Pam Withers crafted a unique novel that combined the excitement of adventure racing with the emotional story line of an adopted child in search of his parents. The plot was solid and there was just enough conflict to keep the reader interested in what was going to happen next. While overall the characters

were fairly well developed, Some of the main characters seemed a little forced and I didn't really understand their behavior or emotions. It should be noted that many of the characters use language that would be considered unacceptable in any school across the country. While I understand that many children use this kind of language, I don't really like the idea of my middle schooler reading it constantly. Especially when it really isn't vital in any way to the story. Overall I would recommend this book to most readers in spite of the language.
