

Complementing the third edition of Intimate Matters, by John D'Emilio and Estelle B. The historical moments captured in this volume will show that, contrary to popular misconception, the history of sexuality is not a simple story of increased freedoms and sexual liberation, but an ongoing struggle between change and continuity.
