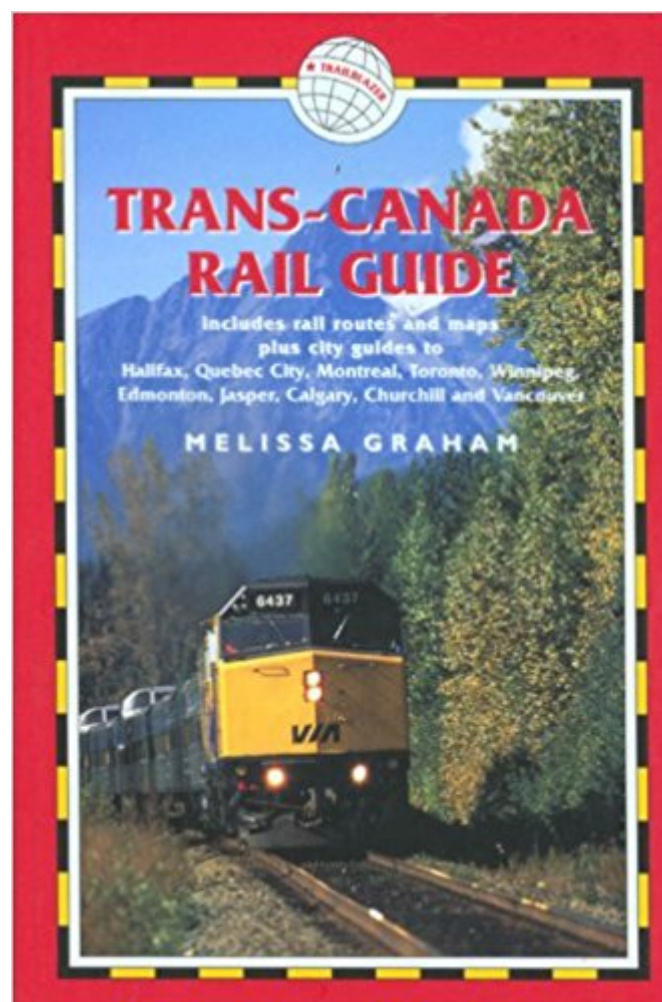

I bought this book specifically in advance of a vacation planned on Canada VIA Rail on a well-known route from Montreal to the Gaspé peninsula. It is omitted from this book. Not even a mention. "Trans-Canada" this book is not. My second beef is that there is a distinct political undertone (pro-French, anti-Anglo) in the Montreal guide section.
