

It was there, in his studio on Pearl Street, that Gramatky saw a Moran tugboat out his window that obviously didnâ™t want to work and kept making figure 8s on the East River. So in 1939 after painting many watercolors of the busy harbor, Gramatky wondered what would happen if a âœtug didnâ™t want to tugâ• and wrote the story.
