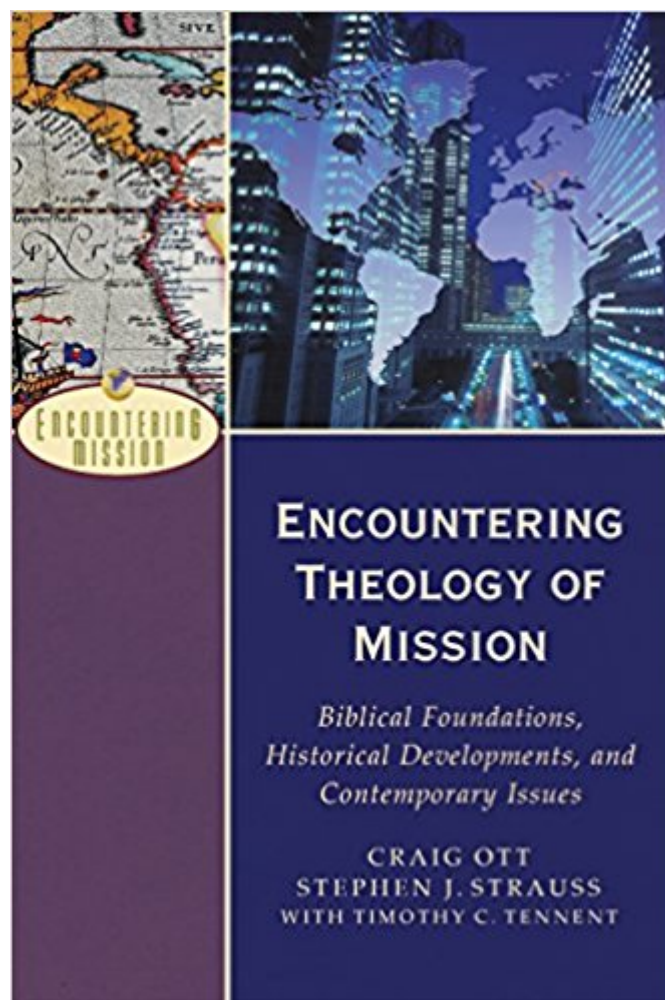




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Encountering Theology Of Mission: Biblical Foundations, Historical Developments, And Contemporary Issues (Encountering Mission)

Encountering Theology of Mission is a tremendously impressive, Biblically-grounded theology of mission. The authors lay out a Biblical foundation for a theology of mission that is both robust and compelling. What is impressive about this work is its strong Biblical foundation, fair treatment of differing perspectives, clear organization and winsome style, and compelling and persuasive positions. The 10-page list of Biblical references in the back of the book shows the profound engagement with the Scriptures throughout the work. Rather than cherry-picking favorite verses and linking all conclusions back to them to support their points, the authors give a well-rounded view of

the Bible's full counsel on mission. Likewise, the work treats the various theories of noted theologians without condescension but also without the need to come to the same conclusion. The book is clearly organized, starting with the *sitz im leben* of mission in the 21st century, building the Biblical foundation from Old and New Testaments, and then embarking on a full theology of mission that incorporates its purpose and nature, task, motivation, and spiritual dynamics, before proceeding to issues of contextualization, encounters with other religions, and thorny questions related to missions. Case studies (or "sidebars") are introduced at relevant points to make the material applicable to real-life circumstances. Ultimately what is produced is a very comprehensive and rich undergirding for the work of Biblical mission.
