

The pictures are beautiful and the writing is very descriptive. There are a couple of shortcomings with the Fodor series, in my opinion: 1) They tend to emphasize touristy and popular (aka expensive) places. 2) There are not a lot of free/inexpensive/offbeat activities listed. 3) I think they tend to
